



Fishing Expedition Evangelism Program Outline

- Direct mail advertisement inviting the community to your Christmas Eve Services. Send out at the latest immediately after Thanksgiving Weekend.
- Announce at all Christmas Eve Services that you will start a special sermon series the second Sunday of January.
- Send out postcards about this sermon series and provide cards for your members to hand out to un-churched friends. One of these postcards should be in every Christmas Eve bulletin.
- Preach a 3-to-6 week series of sermons (non-lectionary) designed to attract non-religious and nominally religious persons to your worship services.
- Go through the same process again using Easter morning services as the kickoff for a second fishing expedition series to start the second Sunday after Easter.
- Develop a follow-up plan to respond to every visitor who attends during the fishing expedition series.



Fishing Expedition Grant

The Northern Virginia Board of Missions is pleased to offer grants to support *fishing expeditions* in our local churches and communities.

These grants are intended to support the production and distribution of professionally-produced postcards (or door hangers) within the communities of our churches. This publicity is intended to support your church's evangelism and outreach efforts within the community. Postcards should serve as invitations to your Christmas and Easter services, as well as an invitation to return to your church for a series of sermons that proclaim the gospel in a way that is relevant to your community.

These sermon series should be developed in keeping with the guidelines and ideas in Adam Hamilton's book, *Unleashing the Word*. It is expected that the pastor of your church has read this book. These sermon series should be creative, innovative and address the needs of your community.

Publicity for these sermon series can take many forms in addition to the postcards. This could include bulletin inserts, banners, church signs, door hangers distributed by church members, and other methods that arise from the creativity of your members.

Designing, printing and mailing postcards to 10,000 households costs approximately \$2,000. To do this twice in a year (Christmas and Easter), churches should budget \$4,000. Clergy colleagues on the Arlington and Alexandria district can offer guidance on how mail might be better targeted and on how to reduce costs by driving postcards to multiple post offices. Congregation members should be invited to participate in this ministry by distributing postcards to friends and neighbors. They may also wish to sponsor the mailing of postcards by making a special contribution or by donating stamps.

This Fishing Expedition program is not an end unto itself. It is simply a tool for churches to use to be faithful to our call to go out into the world making disciples in the name of Jesus Christ. Churches who apply for Fishing Expedition grants are expected not just to carry out the letter of this program, but to live out its spirit, by engaging in evangelism, hospitality and discipleship ministries. The purpose of this program is not to increase numbers. but to increase the church's connection with the community and vitality within the congregation.

Only thoroughly completed applications will be considered. Priority will be given to churches of limited financial means, churches who can demonstrate significant lay involvement and enthusiasm for this ministry, and those applicants who have not received this grant in the past. It is our hope that the more financially-stable churches of the districts will find ways to finance this ministry on their own. If finances are an obstacle, please contact the district program coordinator for assistance. Hard copy or electronic version of the completed application must be submitted to the district office (attention: district program coordinator) by September 19, 2011. Grants will be awarded the week of October 3, 2011.
